## Cohesion's Action for Refugees in Europe

Amendments to [European Fund for Regional Development](#) (ERDF) and [European Social Fund](#) (ESF)

Amendments to the [European Structural and Investment Funds](#) (ESIF) and the [Fund for European Aid for the Most Deprived](#) (FEAD)

- Possibility of 100% EU co-financing for 2014-2020 Cohesion policy funding to be extended for the accounting year 2021-2022
- Possibility to use resources from ERDF or ESF
- Member States' spending on all actions will be eligible retroactively
- The reporting and the programme modifications will be simplified

## €7.5 billion estimated so far

## Recovery Assistance for Cohesion and the Territories of Europe

Recovery Assistance Cohesion Territories of Europe  
– (REACT-EU)

- €39.6 billion 2021
- €11 billion 2022

2022 REACT-EU funds are readily available and **€3.5 billion** have been directly allocated to finance actions to support in the Ukraine crisis and “speed up EU governments’ access to funds to pay for **infrastructure, housing, equipment, employment, education, social inclusion, healthcare and childcare for refugees**”

# Funding support within EU programmes

## Other funding

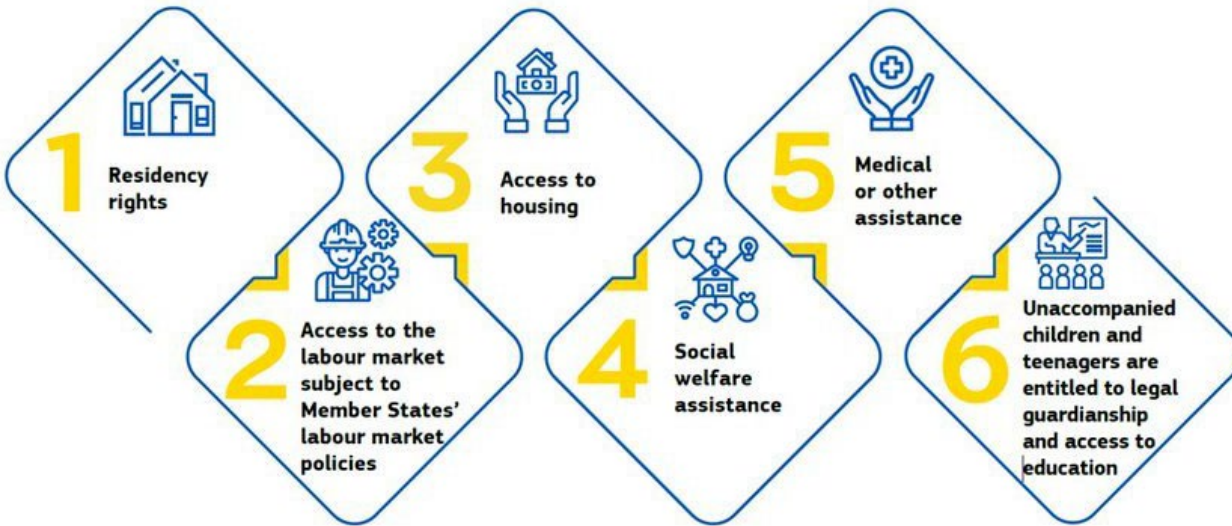
- [Stand Up for Ukraine](#), a global pledging event and campaign that has raised €9.1 billion euro so far
- [Asylum, Migration and Integration Fund](#) (AMIF) a €9.9 billion fund for the period 2021-2027
- Financial support to Ukraine (and neighboring countries) of €600 million (€300 million already disbursed) via the emergency [Macro-Financial Assistance](#)
- [State and Resilience Building Contract](#) (SRBC) –to €120 million to strengthening civilian crisis preparedness and management at both central and local levels (to Ukraine)



# Temporary protection



## Immediate protection and rights to people fleeing the war in Ukraine:



- **Reduce barriers** to provide residency rights, access to the labour market, access to housing, social welfare assistance, medical or other assistance, and means of subsistence
- **Create a protection status** with reduced formalities
- **Enhanced solidarity and responsibility sharing** between the Member States in hosting displaced persons from Ukraine
- **Facilitate support from EU Agencies** such as Frontex, the European Union Asylum Agency and Europol
